## Street Tree Inventories and Neighborhood Stewardship Plans

While walking around your neighborhood, do you see areas available for tree planting, trees in need of maintenance, and neighbors who are concerned but don't know where to begin? Urban Forestry is helping Portlanders take action to improve their community's street trees by conducting tree inventories and creating a Neighborhood Stewardship Plan.

Community groups interested in the cause begin by gathering volunteers to help conduct a street tree inventory. Volunteers are guided by Urban Forestry staff, who provide training, tools, and event organization. The result is a Neighborhood Stewardship Plan. The plan identifies the current status and health of neighborhood street trees and provides recommendations for neighborhood action.

How do I get a tree inventory and Tree Plan in my Neighborhood?

Each year Urban Forestry accepts applications for the project via a competitive application process. A tree inventory and Tree Plan are long-term projects, and require a dedicated group of community members to organize and work together. Planning, inventory, analysis, tree plan creation, and follow-through activities may take two years to complete. Applications for 2013 inventories are due January 15, 2013. ## Possible 2nd Brooklyn Community Garden

At a recent neighborhood association meeting, three potential proposals specific to a site located on SE 17th & Pershing were presented. The site is now being used as a staging area during the light rail construction.

The proposals were: basic landscaping design with grass and tree installations by TriMet; opening the site for potential business development and thirdly, a Brooklyn Community Rail Garden presented by Lee Kamrass.

The Brooklyn Action Corps and TriMet recently agreed to enter into planning negotiations for the community garden option. The site will be made available to the BAC and Brooklyn Community Garden sometime in 2015. The plan is that the community garden will include ADA-compliant growing beds for mobility-impaired gardeners, a community fruit orchard, and garden plots for people on the Brooklyn Community Garden's waiting list. This second community garden for the Brooklyn Neighborhood will be known as the Brooklyn Community Rail Garden.

Ms. Kamrass is the coordinator of the Brooklyn Community Garden, located on SE Franklin and McLoughlin, which was developed last year on an ODOT easement, with 30 plots that opened this past August.

## GARDEN TILE MURAL PROJECT AT GROUT SCHOOL

Parent volunteers are now installing an outdoor tile mural at D.A. Grout Elementary School that celebrates the school's language diversity and its new gardens. A large sun image is made up of word-tiles depicting 'sun' in more than 20 languages that Grout students speak or hear at home. Word-tiles elsewhere on the mural show translations of 'leaf,' a 'flower,' 'bird' or 'bug,' as well as lines of 2nd and 3rd graders' whimsical nature poems. Over 400 Grout students hand-made tiles over the past three years for this project. The bright, fantastic Language Garden Tile Mural is visible to the public on 31st Avenue, just off SE Holgate.

Grout's Language Garden Tile Mural is made possible through grant funding from the City of Portland and SE Uplift's Neighborhood Small Grants Program. The project will be extended into 2013 with a Lowe's Toolbox for Education Grant as well as funding from Portland State University's Department of Applied Linguistics.



# Old Brooklyn Diner Discovered



In the 70's, an article ran in the Oregonian about Brooklyn's Diner. At that time, a waitress figured it had to have been there for 50 years because she remembers her grandfather eating there on a regular basis. The restaurant had several names over the years, The Crossway Café (1930's), The Brooklyn Diner (1940's-70's), Brooklyn Pizza (1970's), and Iron Lady Pizza (1970's).

The Old Brooklyn Diner, which was originally a wooden railroad passenger car dating to the 1890s, has been newly discovered because of construction of the Portland-Milwaukie Light Rail Transit Project. It rests in a building on Holgate and 18th which TriMet has purchased and will deconstruct this spring for street widening and construction of a substation building. Members of the [Oregon Historical Rail Heritage Foundation](#) plan to salvage parts of the car for study and potential display in their new interpretive center near SE 4th and Caruthers.


