17th Ave. Development Meetings Continue

The room was crowded with Brooklyn residents at the June 3rd meeting concerning the upcoming 17th Ave. Development. The apartments between Boise and Mall will house 36 units of studios, 1 & 2 bedrooms, 14 parking stalls and over 52 secure bike locking stations. Also included is 2000 square feet of retail planned for a community market. These are just some of the highlights of the development. Hadi Asgharzadeh, the developer, also met with the BAC on June 12th to go over concerns and questions that were brought up.

Foot Patrol is Alive and Well in Brooklyn

Brooklynites attended a training session with Jacob Brostoff from the Crime Prevention Team on April 24 and re-established the neighborhood foot patrol. After a hiatus of several years, the volunteers of the Brooklyn Foot Patrol have been again walking the neighborhood in bright yellow vests, collecting litter, reporting graffiti using the City of Portland's smartphone app, getting to know their neighbors, and sharing knowledge with each other about Brooklyn.

The smartphone app has yielded immediate results as one patrol group found graffiti reported and removed less than two weeks later. Only two volunteers, trained by the City Crime Prevention Team in a short session, are required to staff a patrol. 


