SE 11th & 12th Avenues Being Studied for Changes

Recently, the BAC were informed that PBOT (Portland Bureau of Transportation) decided to remove SE 9th Street as a possible bikeway and focus on SE 11th and SE 12th between SE Powell and NE Sandy. In order to accommodate this, they would recommend removing some parking, but also eliminating one lane of traffic in each direction. They plan to present this to the Council in January. Because of SE Powell bordering the Central City planning district, they did not discuss this with the neighborhoods to the south of Powell and have not done any studies as to how these changes would impact vehicular traffic in Brooklyn or how these new bike lanes would feed into our neighborhood.

Representatives from PBOT joined us at our most recent board meeting to share their plan and listened to our concerns. They apologized for not reaching out to our neighborhood sooner and said they would remember us going forward. Unfortunately, the time for public comment before the recommendation, has expired and our next opportunity is not until next Spring. Though we are late to the party, they said that our concerns will be considered. We will keep an eye on the matter and report back with any information we have. 
