Diesel Particulates City Wide Meeting in Brooklyn

The September General Meeting, organized by a coalition of neighborhoods, was devoted to understanding more about diesel emissions in the neighborhoods immediately adjacent to the Brooklyn Yard, as well as neighborhoods throughout the city that are also subjected to hazardous diesel emissions.

The high interest in this topic was evident in the large response, necessitating moving the meeting to the Sacred Heart Church. Approximately 130 people were in attendance to see presentations by experts in the field (Dr. Patrick O'Herron, Oregon Physicians for Social Responsibility; Mark Rieskedahl, Northwest Environmental Defense Center and Dr. Erika Moseson, Oregon Thoracic Society. These presentations were followed by a Q&A with a panel of elected officials. (See below)


There was universal agreement that diesel emissions are a serious threat to our health and solutions at all levels of government were discussed. See www.times.org/diesel-pollution for a full summary of the meeting.

In December, the city and county are considering rules for reducing diesel emissions from publicly contracted worksites which, if implemented, could lead to major improvements protecting public health.


