



THE WILLAMETTE CENTER OPENS

The Willamette Center opened in November and is located at 5120 SE Milwaukie. The center is a 24/7 shelter and services up to 120 women and couples, with priority for people 55 and older, experiencing homelessness.

The center is not a drop-in program; all guests are required to have reservations prior to arrival.

The Willamette Center is part of a intentional, strategic component of A Home for Everyone which is a community-wide effort to house homeless Multnomah County residents.

Teutonic Wine Company has been making wine since 2008. Barnaby Tuttle, the winemaker, was inspired by the wines of the Mosel Valley in Germany and Alsace France when he was the wine director at Papa Haydn (in Southeast). After years of working at Papa's, Barnaby quit his job and decided to make wine. He is self-taught but began gaining hands-on experience at a shared facility in Carlton, Oregon. Barnaby and his wife Olga, had an opportunity to plant vines at their friends farm in Alsea, Oregon. They planted Pinot Noir, Pinot Meunier and Pinot Blanc but needed to purchase fruit from additional vineyards in the Willamette Valley.

They began building their own winery in an urban setting on SE 20th Ave. in late 2015 and opened their doors for business in March 2016. This urban winery is located on 20th Ave, just off Powell Blvd, and serves as a fully-functioning winery, tasting room, wine tavern and event space.

Teutonic produced approximately 5000+ cases per year and makes anywhere between 20 and 30 different wines (depending on the vintage and fruit availability.) You can come and visit them seven days a week (Mon - Thurs, 12 to 9 pm, Fri & Sat. 12 to 10 pm and Sun. 1 to 7 pm) and taste their wines in a flight or by the glass. They often host dinner events and casual "Seafood Sundays" during the summer months.

Starting in January 2017, they will begin hosting a monthly supper club with the first one already booked on January 26th with Parallel Food & Wine. Their event space is available to rent for private parties and you can always schedule a private tasting with the winemaker any time.
