

SAVING BROOKLYN SUMMER PARK PROGRAM

As you all may know, the city has decided not to fund the "Summer Free for All" program at Brooklyn Park. Is it wrong? YES, but we need to move on to funding the program ourselves.

That being said, we have repeatedly asked Portland Parks & Recreation (PPR) for more information so we can establish our own "Friends of Brooklyn Park" non-profit. They have not been forth coming with any information let alone communicative. However, the city and PPR have expressed support for us to fund our own program.

LATEST UPDATE: Good news!! We had a meeting with PPR last week. We went over the permit process, insurance, and general requirements. PPR is waiving the permit fees, and granting us access to the shack and all of its goodies. Now we just need to fill out the permit and get insurance and we can start the program. The tricky part is that it needs to be a non-profit or foundation or under an umbrella of a non-profit/foundation. Our fellow Brooklynites are working on setting up the proper organization at this time.

The organization name will be 'Friends of Brooklyn Park.' We will be starting a Facebook page soon with more details. We will have a summer youth program in 2017. However it will have a delayed start while we get our ducks in-a-row.
