Input from Neighbors at January Meeting

At the General Neighborhood meeting in January, residents were asked what their concerns, long term goals and hopes are for the Brooklyn neighborhood.

After the discussion, a vote was taken on what 3 items each attendee wanted to support in 2020. The first priority was given 3 points, the second priority was 2 points and the third was a single point. Attendees could spread their three votes out or apply their votes to one or two items they supported.

- 8. Paving Milwaukie Ave (3 points)
- 9. Increased Social Events Volunteerism (2 points)
- 10. Community Surveys (1 point)
- 11. Signage/Wayfinding Signs (1 point)
- 12. Music in the Park (1 point)

Friends of Brooklyn Park Gala, Preparing for Summer, 2020

Friends of Brooklyn Park held its 2nd Annual Winter Gala at the new Sacred Heart Fellowship Hall on Saturday, February 22nd. The event packed the hall and was filled with live music; fine foods; local beer, wine, and spirits; desserts; and a silent auction. The event was well attended by over 125 Brooklyn neighbors, summer program alumni, and local business owners.

The Gala was kicked off by the neighborhood Martingale Band as guests entered. Many Brooklyn and other SE eateries provided a great spread: Pizza Doughnais, Pok Pok Wing and Spin Catering. Brooklyn based Rose City Coffee, Ruse Brewing, Stone Barn Brandyworks, as well as White Claw provided beverages.



One of the biggest hits of the night was the dessert auction. People seated together at tables pooled their money and bid on the dessert options on display. The desserts ranged from cakes made by some of the top shops of Portland to good ol' chain store items. The table with the highest bid got to pick first, then 2nd highest bid, etc.

Over 30 fabulous items from local artists, businesses, and patrons were donated for the silent auction. Winning guests walked away with a Fender guitar set, a historic walking tour, glass art, fitness classes, martial art lessons, and more. The event raised over \$7,000 for the summer youth program.

The program operates on an annual budget of \$25k. Friends of Brooklyn Park are all volunteers. 501(c) and 3.89% of every dollar goes directly to the program. This covers permit, insurance, and 3 employees (Program Director and 2 assistants). The rest goes to state and federal required licenses, fees and costs to support our fundraising efforts.

Many thanks to our community for coming out and supporting our program and event. There are too many to name here, but our kids and families are lucky to have such a wonderful community to support our neighborhood and make Brooklyn special.




