

Meeting called to order 19:11 Timothy reads the land acknowledgement First agenda item:

Vote to fill board vacancy

Clarification on how we do it:

Elections are in May every year

Every time there's a vacancy outside of that, board can vote to fill the seat

Fewer than 11 members means a vacancy

A few words on notifying board that you want to join.

Marie wants to join the board. Brief motiivating statement: work on newsletter requires board attendance, so wants to be on the board if she has to attend. Various statements in favor of Marie's seniority and corporate memory role

Melaney moves to vote. Seconded by Guy. No discussion, Put to vote. In favor by all but Kimberléa, who abstains. Marie on board.

Kimberléa: Parks contact hasn't gotten back on that site. No site yet picked.

Fire department re: proposed City budget cuts

Isaac McLennan from Fire Dept:

Fire Station 23, Fire logistics center on SE 12th and Powell. Only has 2 members. Can be staffed up to the 4 minimum for an engine or truck during a shift with temporary assignments. The only one staffed with 2 people. Complicated history with the boat unit under the Hawthorne bridge. There's a \$6M PFD budget cut on the table, which city administration has decided can only be done with staffing cuts. Station 23 and at least one other station will be cut under current plan. Happening during an extraordinary time of wildfires, area population growth, pandemic. Staffing frozen at 2013 levels, now cutting below that. Budget advisory committee has recommended against cuts, up to mayor and council now. Impact on BIPOC members of the community will be disproportionately impacted. There will be a budget meeting next week at which concerned citizens can speak. Call to action to ask that staffing levels be maintained. Call volume at his unit is now 4K calls/year, which appears to be a dramatic increase.

Melaney: are they proposing the station be closed?

Isaac: staffing would go from 2->0. 23 currently just does emergency response.

Marie: when is the meeting and the link info, Josh will provide

Isaac: Meeting on Sat 17 in the morning.

Melaney: high senior population in the neighborhood.

Isaac: structure fire a month ago that the 2-person team responded to.

Kimberléa: What's the next closest station? Is it because it doesn't have a truck that it's on the

block?

Isaac: easier to cut with 2 people, 2 other stations reduced by 4 to create 2 rescue units. Calls

the 4-person engine as the swiss army knife of response, 2 person units less flexible.

Stuart: stats for current rescue? Calls/day and how that impacted service level.

Isaac: calling up stats, which he'll also provide with meeting info in a followup. 1622 calls in 2020. 80-85% medical, remainder rescue/fire. His unit responded to 4064. Station 21 on Hawthorne bridge, Station 20, 9, 13 are all the surrounding stations.

Melaney: travel time from those locations counts.

Bagpipe practice?

JK: Points out the increase in density in the next couple of years. 2300 addresses, getting another couple hundred units in the next year.

Kimberléa: ESJC

Community mural, one interesting building and artist. Looking for funding, asking at Regional Arts Council. Will look to expand to other frequently tagged buildings. Changing meeting structure to monthly from twice/month. Grants and awards announced after May 3, \$20K funding and \$80K applications. Working on a document describing what the BIPOC resource board will do. Google drive available with all committee business.

Josh: Land Use & Transportation

Working on Biketown docks in the neighborhood. They are adding some, so there's an opportunity. Talking to businesses about installing a couple bike staples at Brooklyn Station and Coco Donuts. They usually need guidance. Joan and Josh participated in a the PDX Freight Plan meeting, particularly around air quality. Later, JK points out the infrastructure bill before Congress might have a way to get money for river access and other road stuff. Daryl makes points about having a coordinator who can know who to talk to in City government about getting things done. Importance of those personal connections to those government workers. Proposes a land use coordinator for the committee. Josh suggests a list of contacts and notes for the committee. Daryl says info he has is old, but it's the relationships that need to be established.
