- Cost

- How to register?- Contact Info for publication
- Space limited? What is the cap on number of participants
- Any special instructions? Masks; dress for the weather, etc.

We will encourage everyone to submit pics of their events, after the event.

We talked about what we would like to have on the Community Connections Webpage. Elements we want.

- Picture or a gallery of pics that cycle through.
- The purpose of the community Connections and our mission statement.
- Activities- ie new neighbor packets, calendar, community connecting events, map

We have been informed that Portland has opened up Healthy Blocks. With vaccination rates rising and COVID-19 cases decreasing, the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) is unveiling the Healthy Blocks Program that allows Portlanders to apply for free permits to provide more space for neighbors to walk, roll, bike, play, and socialize while physically distanced.

The <u>Healthy Blocks permit</u> allows residents to temporarily close a street to create more outdoor recreation space for people to enjoy while following social distancing guidelines. Local access, deliveries, waste pickup, and emergency vehicles will still be allowed.
