Bulky items like old vacuum cleaners, furniture and scrap wood take up valuable space in our garages and in our homes. Not only will you feel great about clearing out unwanted stuff, you will feel good about the contribution you make to your Brooklyn neighborhood!

Where? 16th & SE Center

Each vehicle will be quoted a price before unloading.

Mixed Waste: \$20 for small loads

\$30 and up for large loads

Accepted: Tires: \$5 without rims, \$8 with rims

No Yard Debris will be accepted this year

#### Recyclable Materials Accepted and Charged:

**Electronics:** Gently used electronics for donation at FreeGeek.

(These will be accepted as per the volunteers interpretation of FreeGeeks rules.)

Styrofoam: Must be #6 packing styrofoam (clean and dry)

Or styrofoam food trays (clean and dry)

Clothes: Clean, wearable clothes will be donated to the

Transition Project (Willamette Shelter in Sellwood) or

Portland Public Schools Clothes Closet.

Clothes with tears or holes will be taken to a fabric recycler.

Scrap Metal: Clean and metal only

(will be taken at volunteer's discretion)

Paint: Accepting household paint in original labeled, solid containers but no rusted cans. 1 gallon size or smaller.

Prohibited Materials: Hazardous waste, remodeling or demolition materials; kitchen garbage and curbside recyclables

Examples of high risk construction materials suspected of containing asbestos: NOT ACCEPTED:

- Flooring: vinyl tiles, vinyl sheet, mastic
- Walls: plaster, decorative plaster, Siding: cement siding shingles
- Ceilings: acoustical tiles, "popcorn" and spray-on texture
- Insulation: spray-applied, blown-in, vermiculite, pipe and HVAC
- Electrical: wire insulation, panel partitions
- Other: fire doors, fire brick, fire-proofing

  - 4. Leave with clear action steps.






# Virtual Spring Auction at Winterhaven School by Brea Ariola

# Summary of Oregon Health Authority Bullseye Meeting by Ione van Rees

On Tuesday evening, April 5, 2022, the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) held the first post-Bullseye heavy metals emissions Zoom meeting, They explained and provided an opportunity for public discussion around the draft findings of the Public Health Assessment (PHA).

The evening's central theme was around the issue of 'What Does Closure Look Like', while noting that closure would not happen that evening nor may ever happen for some.

Two goals for the evening: (1) to explain the Public Health Assessment (PHA) and (2) to conduct a fully responsive Q&A session.

PHA mainly represents a tool. It is based on environmental data from air, soil and water measurements gathered over a year's time. The PHA answers the primary questions regarding health risks and which levels are high enough to constitute a serious health threat.

David Farrer, OHA toxicologist and the main author of the PHA, thanked the community for its valuable input and went on to describe the parameters of data measurements. He discussed the report in-depth. He identified the contaminants of concern and explained the levels of exposure for different community groups, e.g. older people and young children, who each react and suffer differently depending on conditions of contaminant exposure.

John Karabic (BAC Secretary) asked why the monitor near the Brooklyn Garden was missing from the shared map. There was speculation whether that particular monitor was for measuring PM2.5 rather than heavy metals.

DEQ only receives lab data and does not collect it. Current exposure levels measured during the October 2016 to October 2017 indicate that BullsEye had effectively reduced heavy metal pollution, to acceptable levels for city living.

Guy Berliner (BAC Board Member) commented on the 2018 revelations of collusion exposed by the Oregonian, and shared his feelings around the incompetence displayed by DEQ and the City officials.

Chris Eykamp followed, who thought the DEQ at that point in time fell far short from its public duty to protect citizens,

And finally, an important point was made by the mother of a child mysteriously very ill. She commented that the culture at DEQ must support openness and transparency allowing staff to speak out about concerns, and she wants to see a strong whistleblower policy put in place internally. Additionally, this should be highlighted in annual training as a duty of care and responsible maintenance of public trust.
