## BCAT hosts Go-Bag Series focused on Emergency Preparedness

BCAT has hosted two sessions of a 3-part series on go-bags. Go-Bags generally contain 72-hours of essentials for short-term evacuations. As climate risks intensify and earthquake risks persist, Go-Bags and other emergency resources are vital for community resilience.

On July 10th and August 14th, dozens of Brooklyn neighbors joined BCAT members to learn what to pack in a Go-Bag and the best locations for storing and ease-of-access. Additionally, both sessions featured expert guest speakers.

July's session had two volunteers from the Portland Neighborhood Emergency Team (NET) explain NET's role during emergencies. August's session had staff from the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) share information about the city's Basic Earthquake Emergency Communication Nodes (BEECN) system. The August session also focused on tools and strategies for working with neighbors, including maintaining an inventory of skills, resources, and needs - information that will be invaluable during an emergency. As PBEM staff emphasized:

The strongest communities aren't those with the most resources; they're the communities that know each other.

The final Go-Bag session, which is free and open to all, will be on September 11<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. The location is TBD and will be announced in the BCAT newsletter and Brooklyn electronic newsletter. ### Did You Notice?

Greenspace in Brooklyn includes parks, the Brooklyn three Community Garden (BCG), and a portion of the Springwater Corridor!

The three parks that total more than 14 acres include Brooklyn Park, Brooklyn School Park, and Powell Park. These parks offer baseball diamonds, basketball courts, open fields, shelters, and picnic tables for gathering. Brooklyn Park is home to *Tête à* : Tête à Tête (pictured below), a multi-ton sculpture by Marcia Donahue.

The BCG is located at the corner: of Franklin and McLoughlin. In addition to the wonderful growing plots. BCG has an incredible view across the Williamette River.

# **Brooklyn Action Committee (BAC) Meetings**

September 24<sup>th</sup>: City of Portland representatives will provide an update on the two-year-old Clinton Triangle Shelter site.

BAC holds two public meeting types - General and Board usually at Sacred Heart Villa with virtual options. General meetings occur bi-monthly on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday; Board meetings on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday each month.

### **Brooklyn Land Use and Transportation Committee (BLUTC)**

BLUTC generally meets the first Wednesday of every month: however, to accommodate TriMet, the October meeting date is to-be-determined. TriMet has been invited to discuss zoning and land use planning.

BLUTC submitted a pedestrian crossing study of Holgate Boulevard to the Portland City Council Transportation Committee. The study was done to address a surge in crossings, and risky behavior by motorists and pedestrians in the vicinity of the new Brooklyn Carreta.

The study showed that 70% of pedestrian crossings from McLoughlin Boulevard to Milwaukie Avenue occurred at the unmarked 12th Avenue and Holgate intersection, primarily to access the entrance of Brooklyn Carreta. Pedestrians avoided crossing at the nearby McLoughlin crosswalk, presumably because of the danger of right-turning motorists. Several nearmiss pedestrian strikes were observed. Rather than closing the 12<sup>th</sup> and Holgate intersection, as PBOT has done elsewhere, we recommended improving the intersection with a marked crosswalk and signage. This will also benefit motorists by preventing gridlock at 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue and improving traffic flow. BLUTC is hopeful that the City Council will improve safety for both pedestrians and motorists by improving this intersection.

Additionally, BLUTC continues to advocate river access from the neighborhood, access to Ross Island, and correction of the issues that have resulted in toxic algae blooms.


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


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# The Empowered Aging Method with Maggie Mackenzie

The Empowered Aging Method teaches self-care through mindful fitness to stretch and strengthen your body, meditation to help calm and center your mind and creative exploration for fun.







# **Brooklyn Historical Plaques**
