Community Meeting Recap: The People's Depot Proposal

On October 7th, residents and businesses from both Brooklyn and Hosford-Abernethy gathered for a community discussion of The People's Depot (TPD)'s proposed relocation from under the Morrison Bridge to 1109 SE Brooklyn Street (SE Milwaukie & SE Powell). TPD is a nonprofit beverage container redemption center operated by Ground Score Association (GSA). In addition to recycling, TPD offers wrap-around services to improve the lives of its clients.

Designed as an educational forum, the meeting enabled attendees to hear directly from panelists, ask questions, and raise concerns about potential impacts on residents, businesses, and the community. Neighborhood panelists led a Q&A focused on operations, geography, traffic, and community impacts, followed by audience questions/comments. Panelists included spokespeople from both Oregon Beverage Recycling Cooperative (OBRC) and GSA/TPD spokespeople, plus two representatives from each neighborhood. The following notes were provided by an attendee:

Convenience Zone: The proposal creates a 3-mile zone around the site where retailers could stop or reduce hand-count container redemption. Additionally, 23 large retailers would stop accepting hand-counts and direct the community to TPD instead.

Hours & Volume Increase: Proposed operating hours would double to 5 hours per day. TPD estimates the number of canners served will increase from approximately 165 to 300 per day and to nearly triple its annual collections from the current 9 million to 25 million.

Site Risks and Proximity: The proposed location is at a busy intersection (35,000+ vehicles/day), next to an active railroad, and near schools, businesses, and residences. Some attendees raised safety and accessibility concerns for both canners and the community.

Security Mitigation: OBRC plans to add security cameras to the building, and there will be an additional \$500k annually to Portland Police Bureau's Behavioral Health Unit for outreach, and \$75k annually for litter and graffiti removal. No other commitments were offered for the community, though OBRC is open to a Good Neighbor Agreement. OBRC and GSA said it's neither required nor planned to conduct safety/livability assessments, but they do not expect conditions to worsen.

OBRC expects to submit its application to OLCC (the governing body) soon, which will trigger a 30-day public comment period. For details and to submit feedback scan the QR code or visit: tinyurl.com/BottleDropTakeAction



Did You Notice...

Volunteers continue to maintain and beautify the 9th Avenue Overpass, which is a vital connection for the Brooklyn neighborhood by providing safe passage over the traffic-laden Powell Boulevard. Nearly two years ago, a fire consumed the area around this overpass. Neighbors came together to clean the remaining trash, and were then inspired to remove the blackberries and seed native flowers. The overpass saga also newly reformed tested the Portland city government, which required different bureaus to work together for the first time (PBOT, Parks Dept., PEMO, et al) and ultimately led to overpass stewardship being given to BAC. Brooklyn Action Committee (BAC) Meetings

Brooklyn Land Use and Transportation Committee (BLUTC)

BLUTC continues to advocate for Brooklyn's access to the river from the neighborhood, access to Ross Island, and correction of the issues that have resulted in toxic algae blooms. Current negotiations between the City and RISG remain confidential.

Brooklyn Climate Action Team (BCAT)

In September, the Brooklyn Climate Action Team (BCAT) finished its three-part series on creating Go-Bags with a presentation from the Portland Neighborhood Emergency Team (NET), a program of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM). Two quotes from the series reinforced the importance of the neighborhood's preparedness for emergencies:

The historic Gravenstein Apple tree (*Malus x domestica*), which was located on 9th Avenue at Center, was felled. The tree is believed to be the last tree from Gideon Tibbets Orchard, which operated from 1847 until approximately 1887. This magnificent apple tree grew to be well over 65 feet tall with a spread of 68 feet. Though the tree is no more, the flower blossoms were immortalized earlier this year via the sign toppers designed by Brooklynite Ashley Plauché. In 1999, Portland City Council recognized this tree as the 204th Heritage Tree of Portland. The trees on this list are recognized for their unique size, age, historical or horticultural significance. Rest in peace gentle giant. Brooklyn well remember you.
