Brooklyn Action Committee (BAC) Meetings

BAC meetings are held in the **Sacred Heart Villa Activity Room** located at **3925 SE Milwaukie Avenue** (virtual options available), and there are two types of public meetings. General meetings occur bi-monthly on the 4th Wednesday; Board meetings occur monthly on the 2nd Wednesday.

Brooklyn Land Use and Transportation Committee (BLUTC)

BLUTC generally meets the first Wednesday of every month. BLUTC remains focused on neighborhood pedestrian safety concerns, river access, affordable housing, and more.

Brooklyn Climate Action Team (BCAT)

Meetings generally occur the second and fourth Thursday every month. BCAT is organizing a group session for the online **Neighborhood Emergency Team (NET)** course starting **Jan. 22**. Brooklyn doesn't have a NET team yet—let's change that. We'll meet for accountability, and prepare for the required in-person training together.

What is NET?

In the event of a citywide or regional emergency such as a severe winter storm, flood, or major earthquake, households need to be prepared to be on their own for at least a week. Neighborhoods need to be prepared for self-sufficiency, too. Volunteer neighborhood rescuers will likely be first on-the-scene when firefighters and police are slowed by impassable streets or overwhelmed by calls for help.

Neighborhood Emergency Teams (NETs) are Portland residents trained by Portland Bureau of Emergency Management and Portland Fire & Rescue to provide emergency planning and assistance within their own neighborhoods. NET members are trained to save lives and property until professional responders can arrive. These volunteers are specially trained to help others without putting themselves in harm's way. Let's create Brooklyn's NET.

CCC Presents: Brooklyn Movie night - The Big Lebowski

Brooklyn Movie Night is back, man! Join neighbors on February 5th at the historic Aladdin Theater for a night of Lebowski-themed fun featuring a screening of The Big Lebowski, trivia, and a costume contest! Costumes (bathrobes, cardigans, sunglasses!) are encouraged, and White Russians will be flowing at the bar. Doors open at 6PM, costume contest prize will be awarded at 7 pm followed by the screening.



The community is mourning the unexpected loss of an educator, reporter, neighbor, and friend Rita Leonard, a fixture in our community for over 40 years. Rita passed away on December 15th.

For four decades, Rita actively participated in events while wearing both her signature kerchief and contagious smile. In addition to her community activism, Rita was a dedicated educator, serving as a teacher for Portland Public Schools until her recent retirement. Rita documented neighborhood meetings, events, and happenings via her reporting for the local newspaper, The BEE. Rita was The BEE's freelance contributor with the longest tenure, says Eric Norberg, The BEE's Editor and GM.

Ben Tarne, Co-founder and former chair of Friends of Brooklyn Park, remarked, "Rita was instrumental in advocating for and supporting Friends of Brooklyn Park's (FOBP) Summer Youth Program. She was there from day one and continued through all of the years. Brooklyn's community was built on the work and support of Rita, a true neighborhood hero."

Melaney Dittler recounted that Rita's support for the FOBP program was hands-on; she spent years collecting bottles and cans for the FOBP Bottle Drop fundraiser, often delivering 10 to 15 bags a week. Today, that legacy of service continues through her family, as her daughter continues to support the FOBP program.

Neighbor Capi Reed recalled her time at First Presbyterian Church, where Rita famously "bribed" children to attend Summer Sunday School by serving popsicles in the morning—ensuring kids were the ones dragging their parents to church. Whether she was "planting" artificial flowers, so she could enjoy blooms all year long or delivering a plate of Christmas cookies to her neighbors, Rita brought a beautiful smile and a contagious laugh to every interaction.

Rita Leonard didn't just live in Brooklyn; she shaped it. Rita - and her Christmas cookies! - will be deeply missed. It's clear that her legacy will continue to shape Brooklyn. Brooklyn History: The Tibbets

On the east side of the Willamette river, thick forests blanketed the slopes where the indigenous Clackamas people traveled via the 'Oaks Bluff' trail (which is partially retained as Oaks Bottom Trail). A few settlers existed, and then the U.S. Congress passed the 1850 Donation Land Claims Act, which brought an influx of settlers for the 640 acre free sites. Gideon Tibbets (born 1809 in Bangor, Maine) and wife Mary Ann Fox Tibbets decided to take the Oregon Trail west.

The Tibbets left Iowa in 1847, and reached The Dalles in 7 months. While in The Dalles for 6 weeks, they built a flat boat, and subsequently portaged all their belongings down river, down falls, and where successfully saved and pulled to shore by Clackamas people. The Tibbets then had dinner of wheat and black molasses on the existing claim of the Dobbins family. Tempted by southern gold finds, Dobbins turned his claim over to Tibbets.

This claim went from the river to 26th, and from Holgate to Division. This area contained a high ground, a rich river bottom, a meadow, swamp and numerous creeks. The Tibbets cut down firs and cedars to build a cabin, then cleared 16 acres of thick underbrush to plant timothy hay, which they sold for \$20 per ton. The Tibbets went on to rent horses, plant rows of apple and pear trees, kept bees, and turned the meadow into the first grain mill on the east side. This area claimed by the Tibbets was then known as Brookland and 'Brookland Mills Flour', which had renown as the only mill in town. The Tibbets then became more real estate agent than farmer. They sold the mill to James Stevens. Subsequently, the mill burned and was not rebuilt. Tibbets went on to build another house with painted boards, another first on the east side. On the mantle sat a conch shell found in New Orleans, which Mr. Tibbets used to call both workers and family to dinner.

In 1868, Mr. Tibbets granted right of way to the Oregon Central Railroad, and started selling Brookland lots for \$50. He became known as "Father" Tibbets. He founded a school at 16th & Tibbets for 20 kids, was a patron at Brother Wittens singing school and formed a competitive spelling school that had yearly "Bees" with dancing and feasting. Nearby ferry squabbles left Brookland without a ferry, and lot prices dipped to \$5-10/lot. The Tibbets went on to build family home with 4 red diamonds and a green roof. The Tibbets had 9 children, a dog 'Lion' among horses, gardens, trees and shrubs. In 1876, Mr. Tibbets served one term in the Oregon House on a platform of good conduct and good government. Mr. Tibbets passed in 1887, his wife 4 years later; only 1 of 9 kids survived him, and they left 6 grandkids dispersed on the east side. By 1900, the creek was filled in, Southern Pacific RR took over train operations, and Brookland had become the community of Brooklyn.


Brooklyn Historical Plaques


