## Brooklyn Action Corps (BAC): Get Involved!

BAC is our non-profit neighborhood organization, whose purpose is to better the community by working together toward the solution of its social, physical, and economic problems. This work is completed through volunteer effort, and is led by a community-elected Board of Directors. BAC needs volunteers willing to commit 3-4 hours a month to serve on the Board for a minimum 1-year term (no term limits). Typical duties include: attending meetings, reviewing budget requests, supporting/attending neighborhood events, supporting BAC committees, and responding to emails. Although no specific experience is required, applicants should be interested in supporting neighborhood activities and building community. As outlined in the bylaws, the minimum requirements to serve on the BAC Board of Directors are as follows:

**Neighborhood Member:** open to residents, property owners, business licensees, employees, and representatives of nonprofit organizations within the neighborhood.

**Attendance:** Four months before being elected, attend at least two BAC Board meetings, or one prior Board meeting, and at least two BAC general or committee meetings.

**Elected:** 2026 Board elections will occur during the May 27<sup>th</sup> meeting, and nominees meeting the above eligibility requirements must be elected by a majority of voting community members present at the meeting.

### 2026 BAC Visioning Meeting Recap

On January 20<sup>th</sup>, neighbors gathered at the Sacred Heart Villa Activity Room for BAC's annual visioning meeting. As familiar and new faces gathered, we were reminded that this meeting space is graciously provided by the Sacred Heart Villa. The 2026 Visioning Meeting was a space for both sharing ideas and cultivating relationships. Board members reviewed the prior year and explained the BAC financial statements. Also, representatives from the currently active committees provided a recap of the prior year, and many spoke about their vision for the year ahead. In addition to group discussion, those in attendance separated into small groups to meet one another and discuss various neighborhood topics. Topics discussed at the meeting included: neighborhood safety, mutual aid, emergency team training, and the various events hosted throughout the year. 
We can work with you for other scenarios. We offer volunteer opportunities, as well. We're currently looking for board members, and for help with operations.

## Brooklyn Action Committee (BAC) Meetings

BAC meetings are held in the Sacred Heart Villa Activity Room located at 3925 SE Milwaukie Avenue (virtual options available), and there are two types of public meetings. General meetings occur bi-monthly on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday; Board meetings occur monthly on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday. Board elections are soon!

## Brooklyn Land Use and Transportation Committee (BLUTC)

BLUTC generally meets on the first Wednesday of every month. BLUTC welcomes participation and invites you to join the monthly meetings. Connect with BLUTC via email: [bluc@bacpdx.org](mailto:bluc@bacpdx.org)

BLUTC has been active. BLUTC signed a joint letter from 29 Portland Neighborhoods requesting that the Legislature preserve and protect funding for transit during their February short session. Portland neighborhood associations unified on the importance of efficient transit to our lives.

BLUTC has an open dialogue with TriMet on the development of affordable housing on two industrially zoned lots along 17th Avenue. BLUTC input aims to balance neighborhood needs and interests against the need for development to occur swiftly and cheaply. BLUTC is pressing for better amenities in the proposed development, a Request for Proposals (RFP) to increase competition amongst developers, and for more consideration of neighborhood needs, such as commercial space, community space, and parking accommodations.

## BROOKLYN HISTORY: 1900-1920 – INDUSTRIES, SCHOOLS, AND RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS

Brooklyn was becoming a highly desirable location and was filling up fast; lots were selling for \$50 and up. The demand for Brooklyn lots increased because work was easy to find. The Inman-Poulson Lumber Mill was expanding, and the eastside building boom provided many opportunities for new residents. Also, the original Oregon Central RR merged into the Southern Pacific and extended to Salem and Roseburg. This expansion required new rails and new workers. Streetcar ownership consolidation in 1906 resulted in the merger of all independent lines into the Portland Railway, Light and Power Company (PRLPC), which we know today as PGE. PRLPC established the 17<sup>th</sup> Street Shops.

This location serviced and maintained all 80 passenger cars, as well as specialty fire and snow vehicles. Additionally, heavy industries lined 17<sup>th</sup>: King Bros Boiler Works, Brick Factory, NW Nitrox, Iron Fireman, and Libby, McNeill, Libby.

In addition to the easy-to-find employment, the influx of residents was supported by both schools and churches. The original Brooklyn School was built in 1895 at 10<sup>th</sup> & Haig on Milwaukie Ave. The neighborhood also saw the establishment of the first Mothers Club in 1903, becoming the Mothers/Teachers Club in 1904. Service was the premise of the Club. The Club helped families plow gardens, seed potatoes, and mend clothing. Notably, the Club sent aid to San Francisco after the 1906 Earthquake. When the school kept growing, Inman/Poulson donated lumber for a new Kindergarten.



Four more rooms were added in 1911. Vocational classes were held at the school, but overflowing students forced the closure of the Kindergarten in 1911. By 1915, the Club was welcoming immigrants with canning and gardening classes; providing free holly, rose, and fig plants; opening a branch library; helping WWI efforts; and conducting monthly Talks to audiences of 300 or more.

From Brooklyn's beginnings, churches have been active in the community. By the late 1890s, residents were 80% German, and many attended the Mizpah Presbyterian Church at 12<sup>th</sup> & Clinton. In 1893, the Benedictine Fathers established a Convent and Church at Boise & Milwaukie, which is now the Sellwood Apts. When the new pastor, Father Gregory, arrived in 1901, he used a combination of men, horses, and logs to roll the church to its present location. Father Gregory was a dominant force in Brooklyn. During this period, Sacred Heart gave new Brooklynites stability and community by helping immigrants find work, services, goods, and more.


