Brooklyn Action Corps (BAC): May Elections!

BAC, our non-profit neighborhood organization, is led by a community-elected Board of Directors. BAC needs volunteers willing to commit 3-4 hours a month to serve for a minimum 1-year term (no term limits). Typical duties include: attending meetings, reviewing budget requests, supporting/attending neighborhood events, supporting BAC committees, and responding to emails. Although no specific experience is required, applicants should be interested in supporting neighborhood activities and building community. As outlined in the bylaws, the minimum requirements to serve on the BAC Board of Directors are as follows:

- Neighborhood Member:** open to residents, property owners, business licensees, employees, and representatives of nonprofit organizations within the neighborhood.
- Attendance:** Four months before being elected, attend at least two BAC Board meetings or both one prior Board meeting and at least two BAC general or committee meetings.
- Elected:** 2026 Board elections will occur during the May 27th meeting, and nominees meeting the above eligibility requirements must be elected by a majority of voting community members present at the meeting.

Did You Notice?

Neighbors are working together to keep the community safe. Concerned Brooklynites have established an I.C.E. rapid response chat. The purpose of this chat is to spread awareness of I.C.E. in our neighborhood so that we can respond as a community. The chat should be limited to I.C.E. sightings within the neighborhood. Spam and off-topic conversation is not permitted in this chat.

City Club of Portland: Ross Island Report

Ross Island is a 400-acre landscape of islands and a lagoon shaped by decades of sand and gravel mining. Today, it is one of the lower Willamette River's most important remaining opportunities for large-scale ecological restoration, tribal stewardship, and lasting public benefit. That opportunity remains at risk. Reclamation is unfinished, harmful algal blooms and derelict vessels remain recurring problems, and long-term stewardship has not been secured. At the same time, emerging possibilities for coordination with the Portland Harbor cleanup could either help advance reclamation and stewardship, or uncertainty without clear state leadership. Immediate, coordinated action is needed so Ross Island can move toward public ownership or another durable public-benefit stewardship arrangement. The reclamation failures, ownership and liability questions, and broader uncertainty about Ross Island's future linger while the opportunity is closing for coordinated state action. This report reflects more than a year of work by a City Club study committee that heard from 60 witnesses and drew on agency briefings, public records, prior studies, and testimony from tribal leaders, public agencies, environmental groups, recreation advocates, and neighborhood voices. Ross Island is too important to lose.

Brooklyn Action Corps (BAC) Meetings

BAC meetings are held in the Sacred Heart Villa Activity Room located at 3925 SE Milwaukie Avenue (virtual options available), and there are two types of public meetings. General meetings occur bi-monthly on the 4th Wednesday; Board meetings occur monthly on the 2nd Wednesday. Board elections are soon!

Brooklyn Land Use and Transportation Committee (BLUTC)

Brooklyn Climate Action Team (BCAT)

BCAT generally meets the 2nd and 4th Thursday each month to take on the climate crisis — one hyper-local action at a time.

Averaging 15 neighbors per session, BCAT's NET Training Study Group built momentum. Neighbors gathered to work through the program's training videos and prep for the city's in-person NET certification — April's session filled up quickly, with more neighbors already lined up for the next one.

Go-Bag packing events are returning this year; check the calendar for up-to-date details! And, start thinking about what you might need to refresh or build your emergency kit.

The writing-to-publishing process took roughly two years. Carol researched various publishing options, but decided to wing it on her own, and recruited the help of older daughter Geneva on the computer. When Amelia was in 8th grade at Sellwood Middle School, she bonded with the classroom pet, a perky little bantam hen. Amelia convinced her mother to ask the school district's Living Lab to part ways with the chicken. Amelia then renamed the hen to Iris, in honor of her favorite flowers in the family's yard.

The little bantam adapted well to living in an old rabbit hutch in the backyard, and then some unforeseen events occurred: Iris was lost, then found, then lost again...was there fowl foul play?

BROOKLYN HISTORY: 1900-1920 – Community

During this time, Brooklynites lived and worked while establishing a community through toil and fun. It may be hard to imagine, but Brooklyn retail extended to 21st & Powell, and that's where the Last Chance Saloon was found. Terrano's Feed Store was there as well, the only feed store on the east side.

Retail Brooklyn was a series of small shops and businesses along Powell Valley Road and down Milwaukie Ave. Brooklyn "Center" was at the junction of Powell and Milwaukie. It had a park, a fountain, as well as Clappers Dry Goods, Raabes Meats, Brooklyn Drug, a Post Office, a Library, bakeries, tailors, and carriage shops, then subsequently car repair shops. Whatever you needed could be found in Brooklyn.

Although work was apparent, there was always time for recreation. Brooklynites fished at The Brooklyn Lake, which formed within the swamp lands North of Powell and at the bottom of Woodward Street from the Willamette River high tides during the winter months. Brooklyn Park (Milwaukie & Powell) was below grade and considered a 'wild' place at night. By 1910, there were two nickelodeons (shows that cost one nickel) with various shows and dancing: Doc Watkins (Haig & Milwaukie) and Sullivans (Powell & 21st). The streetcars made for convenient trips to both Oaks Park and Sellwood Crematorium. Ross Island was a picnic destination. A young girl traveling past Ross Island said, "That island is mine." A young man on the same boat said, "Well, if you want that island, you have to take me with it, for I own it." She said, "I'll take you," and then the Rosses began their cattle farm together. Both Brooklyn School and Sacred Heart filled out the calendar with events. The community demographics were changing, as the original Germans began to disperse. One theory for the new residents entering Brooklyn is that the Brooklyn community was more free-spirited compared to more conservative neighboring communities. Another theory for the changing demographics is that the street names being changed after WWI, which may have made some of the German settlers feel unwanted. Fifty petitioners enabled the street names to be changed: Frederick became Pershing; Frankfort became Lafayette; Karl became Haig; and, Bismarck became Bush. Whatever the reasons, new immigrants arrived from Italy and Ireland and became part of the Brooklyn Community.

Community stories keep Brooklyn's history alive. Here are some from that time period:

- Roy Neal (b.1906) family rented their home from the only Chinese family, the Yues. Roy's dad rented a site of the current Brooklyn School for \$1 per year to farm, and also was a concrete finisher for the many new sidewalks in Brooklyn. Roy enjoyed fishing and the Doc Watkins Dance Hall.
- Emil Feltz (b.1900) said his dad was a blacksmith and worked on the Oaks Park cables, then became a produce seller; Emil enjoyed swimming to Ross Island.
- Mildred Battaglia (b.1915), her family owned Terranos Feed Store, she enjoyed all the horses, cows, goats chickens and rabbits that everyone owned in Brooklyn.
- Joe Steimer (b.1902), Played at Dutch Flats Ballpark at 14th & Haig, and loved Oaks Park and Ross Island.
- Bud Winter, remembers the Brooklyn Fountain, and being 'Marble Champ'.
- Edward Kasper, remembers the street car that ran into a house, and how horses would run for the train as it went by (horse rings did serve a purpose!)

In listening to one another and sharing our stories, Brooklyn's past is kept alive. Next time we'll explore Brooklyn's heyday: 1920-1930. Do you have Brooklyn story? Email brooknews@bacpdx.org.

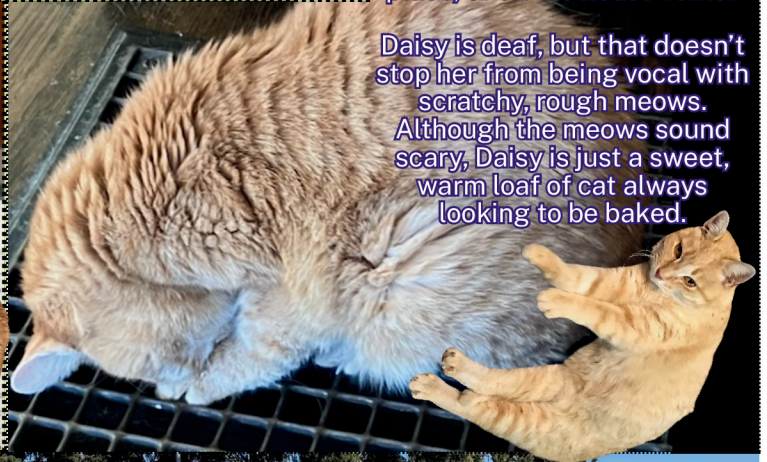
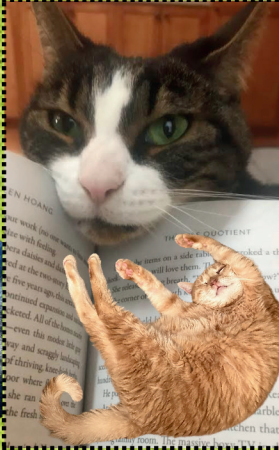
May Pet-of-the-Month

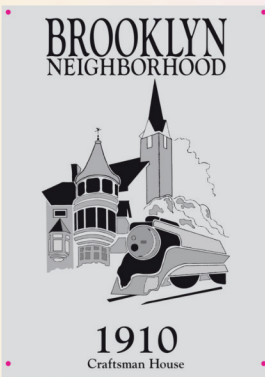

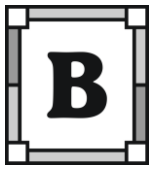

Small businesses get tax cut

- Most graffiti is cleaned within 2 to 10 business days. Cleanup may take longer in certain situations

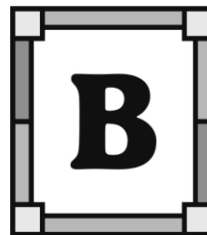

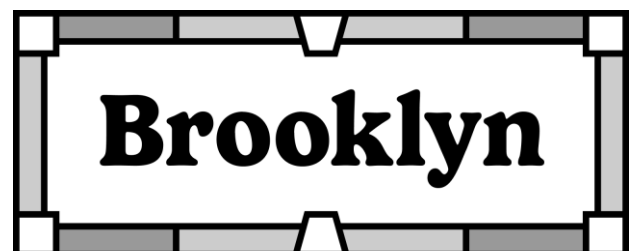

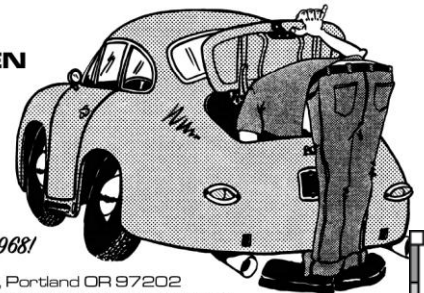
